The race begins at 10:25 am sharp. The Stage 6 Palmdale to Big Bear Lake race will offer one of the race's most challenging courses. From Marie Kerr Park, riders will head east on Rancho Vista Boulevard in a neutral start, providing enthusiasts spectacular viewing opportunities to catch the peloton as it passes through Palmdale. The race begins in earnest as the riders turn south on Sierra Highway, the beginning of a grueling 115+ mile race to glory!



# Palmdale's Crime Rate

## *Drops to a* 20 Year Low



The crime rate in Palmdale has dropped to its lowest level in 20 years. With a 2.71% decrease in the number of Part I crimes reported and a 3.61% drop in the crime rate (crimes per 10,000 residents) in 2011, City of Palmdale and Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department Palmdale have announced that the City's overall crime rate has plummeted to 266.91 crimes per 10,000 population.

This marks the third consecutive year that Palmdale's crime rate has been below 300 crimes per 10,000, a number that puts Palmdale in the category of being a safe city. In 2007, the City of Palmdale set a five-year goal of bringing the crime rate below 300 by 2012. That goal was reached two years ahead of schedule.

"We're seeing a crime rate that hasn't been this low in decades," said Palmdale's Director of Public Safety and Community Relations Anne Ambrose. "It's certainly a great achievement as we celebrate our 50th year as an incorporated City."

"The continuing low crime rate represents a lot of hard work by Sheriff's deputies, city staff and the residents of Palmdale," said Palmdale Sheriff's Lt. Don Ford.

### PAY OR DISPUTE CITATIONS ONLINE


The City has launched a new online service that allows individuals to pay parking and administrative citations — or even dispute them — online 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

## GET FIRE SAFE WITH SPRING CLEANING

As the new Acting Assistant Fire Chief for Division V, I am happy the Fire Department is here to protect lives, property and the environment of our community with rapid responses by skilled and caring personnel. Delivering these services efficiently and cost-effectively in times of limited resources is a high priority.

As winter has now turned to spring, it's time to do some cleaning. Spring cleaning is a great time to make your home fire safe. Take the time to change your heating/AC filters, to remove the lint from clothes dryer ducts and to check electrical cords to be sure they're in good condition as you clean behind the furniture. All these little things make a big difference.

Spring is also a good time to change the batteries in your smoke and carbon monoxide (CO) alarms. Although some of these devices may be hard wired, all alarms include a battery backup which must be changed periodically.

According to the National Fire Protection Association, 95% of all homes in the United States have at least one smoke alarm. However, 65% of home fire deaths occur in homes with no alarm or no working smoke alarms.

The statistics regarding the dangers of CO poisoning are just as alarming. CO poisoning is the leading cause of accidental poisoning deaths in America, yet many people don't know they are suffering from CO poisoning until it's too late. Since symptoms of CO poisoning are like the flu, you might not even know you're in danger at first. Having a functioning CO alarm can protect you and your family from this deadly gas.

## USE OF FIREWORKS IN PALMDALE

Only "Safe and Sane" fireworks are allowed in Palmdale city limits except for the designated "No Fireworks Zone" where even "Safe and Sane" are illegal. The "No Fireworks Zone" includes the Anaverde housing development and anywhere south of the California Aqueduct, as well as neighborhoods located on the south side of Rancho Vista Boulevard along the following lines: beginning at the intersection of Rancho Vista Boulevard and 30th Street West, areas south and west of Rancho Vista Boulevard, north to Avenue N-8; south and west of Avenue N-8 from Rancho Vista Boulevard to 55th Street West; west of 55th Street West; and south from 55th Street West to 60th Street West (Godde Hill Road).

If you are unsure whether you live in the "No Fireworks Zone," you may visit [www.cityofpalmdale.org](http://www.cityofpalmdale.org), click on the Fireworks map link, and enter your address. You may also contact the City's Community Preservation office at 661/267-5234 or the Public Safety Department at 661/267-5181 and staff will assist you.

Illegal fireworks are not allowed anywhere in Palmdale or the Antelope Valley. These are the type that explode or shoot up in the air and they are dangerous and cause a real threat to life and property.

There are hefty fines for using illegal fireworks or using fireworks in "No Fireworks Zones." These fines begin with a \$2,500 fine for a first offense, \$5,000 for a second offense and \$10,000 for a third offense.

Since the economic downturn began, Californians have sought to become more innovative in their money saving and cost-cutting techniques. At the same time, many residents have heard the call to increase our energy independence while reducing California's greenhouse gas emissions in an effort to preserve the environment for future generations. To address these complex problems Los Angeles County has created a solution through the Energy Upgrade California in Los Angeles program.

Energy Upgrade California in Los Angeles County offers residents a variety of incentives and rebates (up to \$8,000 back) for energy efficiency upgrades to their homes. By working with a specially trained participating contractor, program participants receive an assessment of their homes' energy use and specific recommendations to make their homes more energy efficient. Once the selected upgrades are completed, participants typically reduce their energy use by approximately 10 to 40 percent each month and earn rebates and incentives that help pay for some of the costs of achieving those savings. In turn, homeowners not only save money, they directly reduce their impact on the environment by using less energy overall, in addition to making their

homes more comfortable and healthy to live in.

"I am currently undergoing an upgrade right now, and I couldn't be more excited! The Antelope Valley is an extreme climate, and even lowering my utility bills by 10% will make a huge difference," Palmdale resident Mica Schuler said of her home upgrade experience.

Palmdale residents have a unique opportunity to participate in Los Angeles County's Energy Upgrade California program and to receive program rebates and incentives. Additionally, residents who attend one of the upcoming Palmdale area informational workshops will receive a \$200 rebate coupon to be used for

energy efficiency upgrades and will also be entered in an opportunity drawing for a \$300 voucher toward a home energy efficiency assessment. To find out more about the Energy Upgrade California in Los Angeles program and to speak with contractors in person, residents are encouraged to attend one of the many upcoming workshops.

## YARD HOUSE DONATES \$10K TO SAVES





A discount rate is offered for select programs to register two or more children in your immediate family into the **same program**. Discount is not available online.

## Proof of age requirement

Tiny Tots and Youth Sports programs require child's proof of age (birth certificate required for Tiny Tots) at time of registration.

## Payment options

Payment may be made by cash, check, Visa or MasterCard. Adult sports programs require payment by company check, cashier's check, money order or cash (personal checks accepted from team managers only). **Please make checks payable to City of Palmdale.** The City charges a \$25 fee for returned checks.

## Withdrawal/refund policy

Full refunds/credits are available for courses cancelled by the City or instructor. Patron-requested cancellations must be received three days before the second meeting for full refund/credit. No refund/credit will be issued after this time.

For cash or check transaction refunds, please allow four to six weeks to process. **Aquatics program** cancellations must be made seven days prior to the first meeting. Late requests will be processed as an account credit for 50% of the fee. Withdrawals/refunds are not available once the program begins.

## Recreational Swim Guidelines

- Children under 47" in height or under 7 years of age must be accompanied on a one-on-one ratio by an adult 18 years or older.
- A swim test is required for anyone not demonstrating an ability to swim safely in deep water.
- Infants/toddlers must wear swim diapers under suits.
- Only Coast Guard approved life jackets are permitted in pools.
- No cut off jeans or shorts below the knees.
- Masks, fins, snorkels and goggles are not permitted.
- No alcohol or tobacco products permitted within facilities.
- No outside food or beverage (except bottled water) is permitted.
