

## LETTER FROM THE CITY MANAGER



Dear Resident,

Welcome to the Winter/Spring 2012 edition of Palmdale: News, Activities & Entertainment. Here you will find the news and information you need to keep you on top of what is happening and what to do in your City.

It is with mixed feelings that I write this, my last letter for the magazine as Palmdale's City Manager, as I will retire at the end of 2011.

I have never been prouder to be part of this great City as I am now. In my 24 years of service, I have witnessed our community grow from a population of 33,000 to 153,334, making it one of the fastest growing cities in the nation. Over that time, we have invested over \$900 million in infrastructure, which has helped grow all properties in Palmdale to a net assessed value of over \$10 billion.

We have added amenities that would be the envy of any City, such as DryTown Water Park, the Palmdale Amphitheater, two recreations centers and Legacy Commons for Active Seniors. We have seen Palmdale rise as the retail center of the entire High Desert with renowned names such as Macy's, Trader Joes, Yard House, Dillard's, Sports Chalet, Claim Jumper and Barnes & Noble to name a few. We have welcomed businesses that include U.S. Pole, Delta Scientific, NASA's SOPHIA project; seen growth at our aerospace companies at Plant 42; and created several

new state-of-the-art business parks. We also became a Charter City in 2009, which empowers us to have more local control over the decisions that affect us. And we have witnessed the coming of new Palmdale landmarks, Palmdale Regional Medical Center and Embassy Suites Hotel.

In the future, we will begin construction on the Palmdale Hybrid Power Plant, while plans for a conference center and many more exciting business and retail opportunities are in the works.

All of this progress and success has been the result of many years of hard work by our Mayor and City Council, residents and City staff. It has not always been easy. We continue to succeed while enduring the worst economic downturn in over a half century. With your help, your input and your involvement, the City of Palmdale remains fiscally strong. There have been some very difficult decisions over the past few years, but the City of Palmdale will be well positioned for continued growth and success as the economy bounces back.

The future of Palmdale is indeed bright and will be in capable hands for years to come. It has truly been an honor and pleasure to serve you.



# A Sink is No Place for FOG — Fats, Oils and Grease

With the holidays at hand, the City is reminding residents to keep FOG — Fats, Oils and Grease — out of household sinks and drains.

"Hanukah, Christmas, and New Year's Eve are traditionally the times of year when we face some sewer blockages due to the build-up of FOG," said Palmdale's Utilities Services Manager Gordon Phair. "This includes cooking oils, salad dressings, sandwich spreads, meat drippings, juices, fat and other similar products — that are dumped down the sink but NEVER should be. This may result in sewer



backups that can overflow onto the streets and even into the home, which can damage both property and the environment."

Residents are strongly encouraged to take the following steps when handling FOG materials:

- Never pour fats, oils and grease down the sink or garbage disposal.
- Pour fats, oils and grease after they have cooled into a sturdy container, such as an empty glass jar or coffee can. Once the container is full, close the lid securely and place it in the trash.
- Prior to washing, scrape and dry wipe pots, pans and dishes with paper towels and dispose of those materials in the trash.
- Use sink strainers to catch food items, and empty the strainer into the trash.
- To recycle large amounts of leftover oil from deep-frying a turkey please contact the Antelope Valley Environmental Collection Center (AVECC) at 1-888-CLEAN LA (1-888-449-7587). Used cooking oil can be disposed at the AVECC on the first and third Saturday of every month.
- For businesses or households with larger volumes of FOG, contact 661/267-5272 for recycling options.

# Safe Driving Tips for Winter Weather



Winter is here, and the City of Palmdale is offering residents safe driving tips during potentially hazardous conditions.

"The first thing residents should do is to make sure their tires are in good condition with proper treading, and make sure their windshield wipers are in working condition," said Street Maintenance Supervisor Bruce Roadhouse. "Then of course, while driving in stormy weather, it's extremely important to pay attention to road conditions and to reduce your speed."

During harsh conditions, Palmdale's Maintenance Department will be hard at work identifying all storm hazards, identifying flooded roadways, placing "flooded" signs where needed and taking any other precautions needed to ensure residents' safety. When it snows, the City's Maintenance crews will be plowing roadways and salting icy streets.

"Please remember to give these vehicles the proper space of approximately 25 to 50 feet," said Roadhouse, "and please don't pass them. They'll pull over as soon they can to let you pass."

Although the white stuff doesn't happen too often in Palmdale, some snow driving tips include reducing your speed, planning stops, avoid slamming on your brakes, avoiding hard acceleration, and keeping at least five car spaces of distance between you and the car ahead of you.

Residents are also advised not to drive down any roads that are closed due to hazards and to slow down when they see Maintenance vehicles working on roadways or cleaning storm drains.

## HOME SAFETY TIP: Clearly Marking Your Home Address

Something most people don't think about, but is critical in providing quick and efficient service in the event of an emergency, is making sure your address is clearly visible for those responding to your home or business.

Clear directions can be the difference between life and death. To assure your home address markers are prominently seen, please adhere to these tips when posting your address:


- Use large numbers and letters (4" for single-family homes, 6" for non-residential buildings). First, check with civic authorities to see if there are any codes or special designations for posting your home number.

*Numbers on the house should be reflective, unobstructed, and properly lit.*

- If your mailbox is located near the road, numbers should be reflective and posted on both sides.
- Numbers on the house should be reflective, unobstructed, and properly lit.
- If the driveway leads to more than one address, post all home numbers at the end of the driveway and also post the correct number on each building.
- Two or more houses should not share a mailbox.
- Trim bushes, vines, flowers and weeds so all numbers and letters are clearly visible. Numbers and letters can also fade, chip or fall off, so be sure to repair or replace as needed.
- Choose contrasting colors so your numbers can be easily visible.

Remember, properly displaying your home number could save your life!



Mango Languages teaches actual conversation skills for a wide variety of languages. Users are able to track their progress as they learn by creating a profile on the Web site.


"Mango even 'remembers' where you left off in your language learning progress once you have established your profile," Mlynar added.



## Registration information



