

LETTER FROM THE CITY MANAGER

Dear Resident,

What a difference a half decade makes! Six years ago, our nation suffered one of the greatest economic collapses in our history.

Here at the City, things really hit bottom — revenues dropped, staffs were reduced.

However, as the old saying goes, when times get tough, the tough get going. And we did.

In the years that followed the crash, we took a series of steps, lots of steps — some small and some large — that have helped us move forward and create some positive momentum.

In his best-selling book, "Good To Great" author Jim Collins describes this process as the flywheel effect. Kinkisharyo to Build Manufacturing Site in Palmdale

Kinkisharyo, a world leader in rail car production, has announced that it will construct a new, permanent manufacturing facility in Palmdale.

The \$60 million dollar, 460,000-square-foot plant, located on the corner of Sierra Highway and Ave. M, will create hundreds of construction jobs and when completed, provide between 150 to 200 high paying jobs. The targeted completion date is May 2015.

Currently, Kinkisharyo is leasing a hangar at Palmdale Plant 42's Site 9 where the first two railcars are scheduled to be completed by June 2015. Kinkisharyo landed a 10 year, \$891 million contract with MTA in Los Angeles for over 200 rail cars for the Metro system.



City's Solar Projects Saving Tax Dollars, Reducing GHG

The City's new 976-kilowatt DC solar generation projects, located at Palmdale's Civic Center, DryTown Water Park and Marie Kerr Park are designed to generate more than 1,580 megawatt-hours of electricity per year and meet nearly 70 percent of the electricity needs for the three sites. It will save more than \$40,000 annually and reduce greenhouse gases (GHG).

The project required no upfront capital from the city. Solar firm PsomasFMG worked with the city to develop the project. Energy products and services company. Constellation financed the project's development, and will own and operate the system. Palmdale will purchase the electricity generated by the system at a fixed-rate through a 20-year power purchase agreement with Constellation.

The solar power arrays are comprised of approximately 3,200 photovoltaic panels located on shade structures which were designed to blend with the look and feel of the City's surroundings. The system will help the City meet state mandates for renewable power generation and greenhouse gas reduction, and is expected to eliminate 1,201 tons of carbon dioxide annually according to U.S. Environmental Protection Agency data for the region.

ANYWIND OPENS OFFICES

AnyWind Power Energy, Inc. has established its headquarters at 450 W. Palmdale Blvd., and is planning to open its manufacturing facility in Palmdale as well.

Using proven wind turbine technology to produce affordable renewable energy that is independent of subsidies, Anywind is a next-generation total wind power system provider that offers solutions to meet both energy and environmental needs. Driving down the cost of wind power is their key target as they strive to make renewable energy independent of subsidies.

"Their product will be sold not only here in California, but throughout the country and the world," said Palmdale's Director of Economic Development and Communications Dave Walter. "This has great potential to generate hundreds of jobs and millions of dollars in revenue, while providing homeowners and businesses with a quality renewable source of electricity."





Crime Rate Continues DOWNWARD TREND


The latest public safety statistics released by the Palmdale Sheriff's station show the continuing plunge in the crime rate in Palmdale. For 2014, the estimated crime rate is 255 Part I crimes per 10,000. Since 2007, crime had plummeted a whopping 32 percent.

The successful combination of the Sheriff's, City staff and residents working together has been an effective collaboration that has proved to be successful.


In addition to "Tie-One-On," drivers are encouraged to drive with their headlights

Transit Grants Help City to Prepare for Intermodal Transportation Hub

Earlier this year, the Metro Board awarded the City of Palmdale a Transit Oriented Development (TOD) grant to help the City update its General Plan and Zoning Ordinance to reflect the City's current vision for the Palmdale Transportation Center and future California High Speed Rail Station.

This grant, when combined with other similar grants, will provide more than \$1.4 million dollars to help Palmdale create an intermodal transportation and multi-use center that will be unlike any other in the world.

The vision is to integrate California High Speed Rail, Xpress West, Metrolink, Palmdale Airport, High Desert Corridor, AVTA, Greyhound and Amtrak with neighborhoods, housing, restaurants, entertainment and retail to provide residents with more transportation and housing choices where residents can live, work, play and maintain a lifestyle that is convenient, affordable and active.

"TOD is typically defined as more compact development within easy walking distance of public transit and contains a mix of uses such as housing, jobs, recreation, shops, restaurants and entertainment," said Assistant Planner Carlos Contreras. "It creates walkable, pedestrian/bicycle/public transit friendly communities for people of all ages and incomes.

"One of the primary issues facing the City of Palmdale and the Antelope Valley is the lack of easily accessible public transit and functional neighborhoods with a mix of land uses," said Transportation/GIS Manager Mike Behen. "Tens of thousands of people are essentially forced to commute to and from the Los Angeles basin for work. Nearly 71,000 workers from the Antelope Valley travel to Greater Los Angeles. Approximately 63,000 workers from the Palmdale and Lancaster areas spend at least an hour each day on the road; of those, approximately 38,000 spend two or more hours commuting."

"Not only does this impact the air quality and economic prosperity of Palmdale and the Antelope Valley, but daily commuters are negatively impacted by social, health and economic issues as a direct result of long commute times," Behen said. "We're working on some real solutions to address those issues."

PALMDALE TO BURBANK LEG OF HIGH SPEED RAIL PROJECT IN THE WORKS

California High-speed Rail officials recently announced their intention to begin work on the segment between Burbank and Palmdale in the next several years as they continue working on a 130-mile stretch of the line in the Central Valley.

"This is great news for everyone in the Antelope Valley," said Transportation/GIS Manager Mike Behen. "A Palmdale to Burbank bullet train trip would only take 14 to 16 minutes, and that makes it a game changer. It will have the kind of positive economic effect on the Valley that the freeway did when it opened decades ago. Plus, it will take thousands of cars off the road, clean the air, and improve the quality of life for our residents."

Keeping Fats, Oils & Grease Out of Your Sink

It has been almost a year and a half since there has been a sewer overflow due to — Fats, Oils and Grease (FOG) in Palmdale thanks to an aggressive sewer cleaning campaign, and increased awareness and efforts on the part of local residents and businesses to keep it out of household sinks and drains.

With holidays fast approaching, the City is reminding everyone to remain vigilant in their

efforts to keep FOG out of the sewer system. "Thanksgiving and Christmas are the two times of the year when we traditionally face some sewer blockages due to the build-up of fats, oils and grease — which include cooking oils, salad dressings, sandwich spreads, meat drippings, meat juices, meat fat and other similar products — that are dumped down the sink," said Palmdale's Utilities Services Manager Gordon Phair. "Deep-frying turkeys is very popular but many people do not know the proper procedure to dispose of the used cooking oil. This used cooking oil should be disposed of at the Antelope Valley Environmental Collection Center (AVECC), which is open on the first and third Saturday of every month."

"Eventually, dumping FOG items down the sink results in sewer backups that can overflow onto the streets and even into the home, which can damage both property and the environment," Phair said.

The City of Palmdale recommends the following in regard to handling FOG materials:

- Never pour fats, oils and grease down the sink or garbage disposal.
- Pour fats, oils and grease, after they have cooled, into a sturdy container, such as an empty glass jar or coffee can. Once the container is full, close the lid securely and place it in the trash.
- Prior to washing, scrape and dry-wipe pots, pans and dishes with paper towels and dispose of those materials in the trash.
- Use a sink strainer to catch food items, and empty the strainer into the trash.
- To recycle large amounts of leftover oil from deep-frying a turkey, please contact the Antelope Valley Environmental Collection Center (AVECC) at 1-888-CLEAN LA (1-888-449-7587).
- For businesses or households with larger volumes of FOG, contact 661/267-5272 for recycling options.

"By helping to prevent sewer blockages, you are helping your home, your pocketbook, and the environment," said Phair. "It is important to remember that each household in our City plays an important role in preventing neighborhood sewer blockages."





Fall registration begins online and in person, August 18 at 7:30 am unless otherwise noted.

Online Registration

Visit www.cityofpalmdale.org/playpalmdale and click on the registration link. Activities available for online registration are identified by a 'mouse' icon.

- **New customers** and those who have not registered within the past five years must visit the recreation and culture office to open an account. Proof of address (Calif. I.D. or utility bill) is required to verify Palmdale residency. An e-mail address must be provided to register online.
- **Returning customers who have not provided an e-mail address** must call recreation and culture to obtain a Family ID and Account PIN.
- **Returning customers who have provided an e-mail address** may obtain a Family ID and Account PIN by visiting www.cityofpalmdale.org/playpalmdale. Answers to frequently asked questions are available on the Web site.

Registration information

Some classes require on site registration. In most cases, students must be enrolled with payment prior to participation. Register online or at the recreation and culture office. You may register during operating hours in person, by fax or phone. Programs are filled on a first-come, first-served basis. Information is subject to change.

Resident/non-resident information

Resident and non-resident fees are in place to benefit Palmdale residents. Those living outside Palmdale city limits pay an extra fee for some registrations.

Sibling discount

A discount rate is offered for select programs to register two or more children in your immediate family into the **same program**. Discount is not available online.

Proof of age requirement

Tiny Tots and Youth Sports programs require child's proof of age (birth certificate required for Tiny Tots) at time of registration.

Payment options

Payment may be made by cash, check, Visa or MasterCard. Adult sports programs require payment by company check, cashier's check, money order or cash (personal checks accepted from team managers only). **Please make checks payable to City of Palmdale.** The City charges a \$25 fee for returned checks.

Withdrawal/refund policy

Full refunds/credits are available for courses cancelled by the City or instructor. Patron-requested cancellations must be received three days before the second meeting for full refund/credit. No refund/credit will be issued after this time. For cash or check transaction refunds, please allow four to six weeks to process. **Aquatics program** cancellations must be made seven days prior to the first meeting. Late requests will be processed as an account credit for 50% of the fee. Withdrawals/refunds are not available once the program begins.

Cancellation of programs due to weather or facility maintenance will be processed as an account credit on a per participant/class basis.

Contract Instructor Material Fees

In addition to the registration fee some contract instructors may charge a material fee for supplies or costumes. Material fees are paid directly to the contract instructor and are the responsibility of the instructor. Any issues with supplies received or refund requests must be handled directly with the contract instructor.

Waiver

A signed Release, Waiver, and Assumption of Risk is required for all program participants.

Aqua Pass
