

As you may know, we have a new Strategic Plan, which is illustrated by the "Wheel of Success" shown below. It outlines the City's three main goals — a sustainable community, economy and organization — that represent

Have a Safe and Sane 4th of July

USE OF FIREWORKS IN PALMDALE

Only "Safe and Sane" fireworks are allowed in Palmdale city limits except for the designated "No Fireworks Zone" where even "Safe and Sane" are illegal. The "No Fireworks Zone" includes the Anaverde housing development and anywhere south of the California Aqueduct, as well as neighborhoods located on the south side of Rancho Vista Boulevard along the following lines: beginning at the intersection of Rancho Vista Boulevard and 30th Street West, areas south and west of Rancho Vista Boulevard, north to Avenue N-8; south and west of Avenue N-8 from Rancho Vista Boulevard to 55th Street West; west of 55th Street West; and south from 55th Street West to 60th Street West (Godde Hill Road).

If you are unsure whether you live in the "No Fireworks Zone," you may visit www.cityofpalmdale.org, click on the Fireworks map link, and enter your address. You may also contact the City's Code Enforcement office at 267-5234 or Neighborhood Services Dept. at 267-5181, and staff will assist you.

Illegal fireworks are not allowed anywhere in Palmdale or the Antelope Valley. These are the type that explode or shoot up in the air: They are dangerous and cause a real threat to life and property.



FIREWORKS SAFETY TIPS

THE CITY IS OFFERING THESE IMPORTANT SAFETY TIPS FOR RESIDENTS WHO USE "SAFE AND SANE" FIREWORKS IN LEGAL AREAS OF THE CITY OF PALMDALE:

- Always read directions and use common sense.
- Have an adult present.
- Use outdoors only — away from buildings, vehicles, dry grass and other flammable objects.
- Light one at a time, then move quickly away.
- Keep others at a safe distance.
- Never point or throw fireworks at another person.
- Never alter or take apart fireworks.
- Do not give to young children under any circumstances.
- Have a bucket of water handy for emergencies and for dousing misfired and spent fireworks.
- Never attempt to relight or fix malfunctioning fireworks.





FIREWORKS SAFETY TIPS FOR PETS

To protect your pet on the Fourth of July, take these precautions:

- Resist the urge to take your pet to fireworks displays.
- Keep your pets indoors at home in a sheltered, quiet area. Leave a television or radio playing at normal volume to keep him company.
- Consult your veterinarian before July 4th for ways to help alleviate the fear and anxiety he or she may experience during fireworks displays.
- Never leave pets outside unattended. In their fear, pets who normally wouldn't leave the yard may escape and become lost, or become entangled in their chain, risking injury or death.

How to Create Fire Safe Landscaping

FIRE HAZARDS COULD BE RIGHT IN YOUR OWN BACKYARD

The Los Angeles County Fire Department takes great measures in protecting you and your property from wildfire, but they need your help in preparing your home and landscape to be wildfire ready.


Hardening your home, modifying native brush, and addressing ornamental vegetation on your property are all critical elements in whether or not your home will survive a wildfire. County firefighters urge you to learn more about what types of trees, brush and ornamental shrubs are on your property — and what fire hazards could be right in your own backyard.

The first step is to create a defensible space perimeter by thinning trees and brush within 30 feet — essentially a fire break around your home. This includes ornamental plants and trees known to be flammable, such as acacia, cedar, cypress, eucalyptus, juniper, pine and pampas grass. In high hazard areas, the clearance requirement may extend to 200 feet from the home.

Preventing conditions where fire can travel from native brush through ornamental landscape to your home, is the key to creating defensible space. Trees touching or overhanging your home must be pruned back to provide a minimum of five feet of separation, and chimneys need 10 feet of clearance.

Also make sure to store flammable materials, liquids and solvents in metal containers outside at least 30 feet away from your home and any wooden fences. Stack firewood at least 30 feet away from your home, and clean up dead vegetation, which can act as pure fuel for a fire.

HERO Energy Efficiency Program Now Available to Palmdale Owners

The HERO Financing Program, the largest energy efficient financing program in the nation, is now available to homeowners in Palmdale. The HERO Program is a local municipality sponsored program which empowers homeowners to make their homes more energy efficient by providing low-cost, tax deductible financing for a wide range of home improvement projects.

More than 150,000 products for energy and water efficient improvements are available to property owners through the HERO Program. Among the most popular upgrade projects are whole-home

heating and cooling (HVAC), solar power panel installations, energy-saving windows, roofing and insulation. Property owners are able to borrow up to 15 percent of the property value and repay the loan over 5, 10, 15 or 20 years through an assessment on their property tax bill. The HERO Program is different from traditional consumer financing because approvals are based primarily on the amount of equity a homeowner has in their home, not on household income or FICO scores.

Fair Housing speakers can meet with your clubs, groups, work training and rental communities.

The City's partnership with the Housing Rights Center will provide free assistance with housing discrimination investigation, enforcement and impact litigation, outreach and public education, and landlord-tenant counseling.

FREE HOUSING RIGHTS CLINICS

Free walk-in clinics are available every 3rd Thursday of the month from 1 to 4 pm to answer your questions, advocate on your behalf, and assist with landlord-tenant issues.

The clinics cover questions about fair housing, evictions, security deposits, repairs, rent increases and more. They are held at South Antelope Valley Emergency Services (SAVES), located at 1002 East Avenue Q-12.



Water Conservation: A Top Priority

The State of California is asking the Palmdale Water District to support Governor Brown's call to action on the State's drought emergency and is asking for 20% conservation statewide.

2013 was the driest year in California's recorded history, and drought conditions are not over yet. Throughout the state, California's rivers and reservoirs are below their record lows, and snow packs in northern California are 20 percent of normal average for this time of year.

The Palmdale Water District (PWD) and other water agencies are supporting the State's call for a 20 percent reduction in water use. Although PWD plans in advance and has made sure their customers will have water, we all must do our very best to make every drop count. This means changing habits like fixing indoor and outdoor leaks immediately, turning water off while brushing your teeth or washing vegetables, and changing irrigation watering schedules as the weather changes. Be water wise!

Using water wisely is a way of life!


- ✓ Avoid flushing the toilet unnecessarily.

- ✓ Use a shut off nozzle on your hose for washing the car. Better yet, take it to the car wash.
- ✓ Retrofit all household faucets with aerators with flow restrictors.
- ✓ Replace shower heads with low flow version.
- ✓ Do not over water your lawn.
- ✓ Raise lawn mower blade to 3 inches.
- ✓ Use drip irrigation or soaker hoses.
- ✓ Do not use ornamental water features.
- ✓ Do not pour water down the drain, use it wisely!

City Slams Door Shut on Drug House

Earlier this year, the City obtained a preliminary injunction in LA County Superior Court to close down and board up for a period of one year a home which had been the location of at least 36 drug related arrests, one arrest for assault with a deadly weapon, and one arrest of a convicted felon possessing ammunition at the property since January 2011.

"This property had been a nuisance to the surrounding neighborhood for too long," said Palmdale Assistant Attorney Noel Doran. "The removal of this problem from the community will allow an otherwise vibrant neighborhood to thrive. The City Council has made neighborhood improvement a focus for 2014, and city staff has really embraced that mandate. While staff will continue to work hard on neighborhood issues, we really need the citizens to step forward and help us identify the areas that need improvement. I'd ask any citizen that is aware of a problem in their neighborhood to contact our Neighborhood Services Department."

ILLEGAL DUMPING



The City has partnered with S. Groner Associates Inc. to curb illegal dumping. The campaign consists of a pilot campaign targeting tenants at multi-unit complexes and a city wide advertising campaign prompting residents to report illegal dumping via the hotline, 1-888-8-DUMPING (1-888-838-6746).

"We host a couple of community wide clean up events each year," said Administrative Analyst Ben Lucha. "It is amazing and unfortunate how much trash is dumped in the desert. Residents can help reduce that by reporting illegal dumping. We encourage everyone to call in if they see illegal dumpers in the act, or if they come across any locations where illegal dumping has occurred."

Online Registration

Visit www.cityofpalmdale.org/playpalmdale and click on the registration link. Activities available for online registration are identified by a 'mouse' icon.

- **New customers** and those who have not registered within the past five years must visit the recreation and culture office to open an account. Proof of address (Calif. I.D. or utility bill) is required to verify Palmdale residency. An e-mail address must be provided to register online.
- **Returning customers who have not provided an e-mail address** must call recreation and culture to obtain a Family ID and Account PIN.
- **Returning customers who have provided an e-mail address** may obtain a Family ID and Account PIN by visiting www.cityofpalmdale.org/playpalmdale. Answers to frequently asked questions are available on the Web site.

Registration information

Some classes require on site registration. In most cases, students must be enrolled with payment prior to participation. Register online or at the recreation and culture office. You may register during operating hours in person, by fax or phone. Programs are filled on a first-come, first-served basis. Information is subject to change.

Resident/non-resident information

Resident and non-resident fees are in place to benefit Palmdale residents. Those living outside Palmdale city limits pay an extra fee for some registrations.

Sibling discount

A discount rate is offered for select programs to register two or more children in your immediate family into the **same program**. Discount is not available online.

Proof of age requirement

Tiny Tots and Youth Sports programs require child's proof of age (birth certificate required for Tiny Tots) at time of registration.

Payment options

Payment may be made by cash, check, Visa or MasterCard. Adult sports programs require payment by company check, cashier's check, money order or cash (personal checks accepted from team managers only). **Please make checks payable to City of Palmdale.** The City charges a \$25 fee for returned checks.

Withdrawal/refund policy

Full refunds/credits are available for courses cancelled by the City or instructor. Patron-requested cancellations must be received three days before the second meeting for full refund/credit. No refund/credit will be issued after this time. For cash or check transaction refunds, please allow four to six weeks to process. **Aquatics program** cancellations must be made seven days prior to the first meeting. Late requests will be processed as an account credit for 50% of the fee. Withdrawals/refunds are not available once the program begins.

Cancellation of programs due to weather or facility maintenance will be processed as an account credit on a per participant/class basis.

Contract Instructor Material Fees

In addition to the registration fee some contract instructors may charge a material fee for supplies or costumes. Material fees are paid directly to the contract instructor and are the responsibility of the instructor. Any issues with supplies received or refund requests must be handled directly with the contract instructor.

Waiver

A signed Release, Waiver, and Assumption of Risk is required for all program participants.

- The City of Palmdale reserves the right to prohibit any individual from participating.

Aqua Pass

Those using select aquatic programs must present a pre-paid reloadable Aqua Pass. Passes can be obtained at the recreation and culture office. Must be at least 14 years of age to obtain an aqua pass.





Levels

PARENT/CHILD – (6 MOS.-3 YRS.)

Ages 6 months to 3 years. Parent, or other adult, will receive guided demonstration to help their child become more comfortable in the water through song and play. Parents learn how to work with their child on how to introduce bubble-blowing, assist with arm and leg motion, and holds for front and back float along with safety information. Babies must wear swim diapers under their swim suits and must be accompanied in the water by an adult.

Session Fee (Session A, B, C, D or E): \$20R/\$25NR

PRESCHOOL - (3 YRS.-5YRS.)

Introduction to the water without a parent. This class teaches your child to be more comfortable in the water, learn breath control by blowing bubbles and breath-holding, floating, kicking, underwater exploration, and combination of arm and kick movements. Emphasizes water adjustment, safety, and fun.

Session Fee (Session A, B, C, D or E): \$40R/\$48NR

LEVEL 1 – INTRODUCTION TO WATER SKILLS

Introduction to water skills. For children with little or no experience with swim lessons. Participants become familiar with the aquatic environment and learn elementary skills such as blowing bubbles, submersion, assisted floating, gliding, and arm/leg action to build on as they progress through the swim program.

Session Fee (Session A, B, C, D or E): \$40R/\$48NR

LEVEL 2 – FUNDAMENTAL AQUATIC SKILLS

Must be able to: Enter pool unassisted, retrieve an object from below the surface with eyes open, flutter kick, maintain assisted front and rear float, recover to a standing position and exit the pool unassisted. This class builds on fundamental aquatic locomotion, safety and rescue skills presented in Level 1. Emphasis placed on swimming skills.

Session Fee (Session A, B, C, D or E): \$40R/\$48NR

LEVEL 3 - STROKE DEVELOPMENT

Must be able to: Jump from side of pool unassisted, submerge and retrieve an object from the bottom of the pool with eyes open, float unassisted on stomach and back, tread water, display forward locomotion with alternating arms and a rhythmic kick. This class builds on aquatic locomotion, safety, and rescue skills taught in Levels 1 & 2. Class also prepares students for advanced levels of swimming.

Session Fee (Session A, B, C, D or E): \$40R/\$48NR

LEVEL 4- STROKE IMPROVEMENT

Must be able to: Dive into pool from a compact or stride position, swim underwater, perform a feet-first surface dive, survival float, perform open turns on both front and back, and show competency in front crawl, breaststroke, butterfly and backstroke. Class develops confidence and competency in aquatic locomotion, safety and rescue skills, and prepares student swimmers for stroke analysis.

Session Fee (Session A, B, C, D or E): \$40R/\$48NR

LEVEL 5/6 COMBO - SWIMMING AND SKILL PROFICIENCY

Must be able to: Demonstrate sidestroke, breaststroke and freestyle. Class coordinates and refines key strokes presented in previous levels and enables students to use them with greater ease, efficiency, power and smoothness over greater distances. This class introduces the butterfly, open turns, feet-first surface dive, pike dive, tuck surface dive, additional turns and endurance swimming.

Session Fee (Session A, B, C, D or E): \$40R/\$48NR

PRIVATE LESSONS – (3 YRS.-ADULT)

Certified instructors provide 30 minutes of one-on-one teaching with you or your child towards specific swimming goals geared to the individual's ability level and age.
