





Wright Brothers Apartments at Transit Village, the City of Palmdale's innovative new housing development located next to the Palmdale Transportation Center, is accepting applications for one, two and three bedroom apartments.

Interested persons may pick up an application at the City of Palmdale's Neighborhood House #1, located at 503 East Avenue Q3, Monday – Friday, 9 am-5 pm and Saturday, 10 am-2 pm.

STORM DRAIN IMPROVEMENTS ON 35TH EAST

The proposed 35th St. E. storm drain extension project, which is anticipated to begin in June 2014 and end in October 2014, will mitigate the repeated flooding along 35th Street East, especially at the intersection of Avenue Q and 35th St. E. The project will extend the existing storm drain system in 35th St. E. from Palmdale Boulevard and continue northerly in 35th St. E. to Avenue Q, with the terminus to drain into an existing natural drainage channel. Storm drain improvements will include the installation of approximately 2,500 linear feet of 72-inch, 48-inch, 36-inch, 24-inch and 18-inch reinforced concrete pipes with drainage manholes, inlet and outlet structures. - When paying, make sure the website address begins with "https." The "s" at the end means it is secure and the website encrypts your information.
- Look for the padlock icon in the browser bar. If the padlock icon appears on the webpage, but not in the browser bar, it might be a graphic a cybercriminal embedded to trick you into thinking the website is secure.

Upgraded Services for My-waste Phone App



Officials from the City of Palmdale and Waste Management have announced new upgraded services to the free new smart phone app called “my-waste™” which was launched earlier this year.


In addition to enabling residents to receive alerts of trash/recycling collection days, notifications for street sweeping and a forum for general questions regarding street sweeping and trash/recycling services, the new upgrades allow residents to report certain issues directly to the City staff who will handle it.

“Using the GPS function on their phone, residents can report graffiti, downed trees, broken sprinklers, flooding or other issues to the staff person who is responsible for handling it and pinpoint the exact location,” said Administrative Analyst Ben Lucha.

“These new features are compatible with iPhones and Droids,” Lucha explained. “If you already have the app, all you need to do is open it and download the new content. If you don’t have the app, just visit www.cityofpalmdale.org/departments/publicworks/mywaste.html with your smartphone, select the appropriate icon and download the app free of charge.”

The “my-waste™” app is also available free via the App Store on iPhone and Droid, and is available for Google Play on Droid.

Other benefits of the app include allowing residents the option to receive reminders during times when there are changes to their schedule such as holidays, providing answers to frequently asked questions, offering a quick and easy way to figure out whether or not an item is recyclable, and allowing the reporting of issues such as missed collections or street sweeping.

registration information

Winter/Spring registration begins online and in person, December 16 at 7:30 am unless otherwise noted.

Online Registration

Visit www.cityofpalmdale.org/playpalmdale and click on the registration link. Activities available for online registration are identified by a 'mouse' icon.

- **New customers** and those who have not registered within the past five years must visit the recreation and culture office to open an account. Proof of address (Calif. I.D. or utility bill) is required to verify Palmdale residency. An e-mail address must be provided to register online.
- **Returning customers who have not provided an e-mail address** must call recreation and culture to obtain a Family ID and Account PIN.
- **Returning customers who have provided an e-mail address** may obtain a Family ID and Account PIN by visiting www.cityofpalmdale.org/playpalmdale. Answers to frequently asked questions are available on the website.

Registration information

Some classes require on-site registration. In most cases, students must be enrolled with payment prior to participation. Register online or at the recreation and culture office. You may register during operating hours in person, by fax or phone. Programs are filled on a first-come, first-served basis. Information is subject to change.

Resident/non-resident information

Resident and non-resident fees are in place to benefit Palmdale residents. Those living outside Palmdale city limits pay an extra fee for some registrations.

Sibling discount

A discount rate is offered for select programs to register two or more children in your immediate family into the **same program**. Discount is not available online.

Proof of age requirement

Tiny Tots and Youth Sports programs require child's proof of age (birth certificate required for Tiny Tots) at time of registration.

Payment options

Payment may be made by cash, check, Visa or MasterCard. Adult sports programs require payment by company check, cashier's check, money order or cash (personal checks accepted from team managers only). **Please make checks payable to City of Palmdale.** The City charges a \$25 fee for returned checks.

Withdrawal/refund policy

Full refunds/credits are available for courses cancelled by the City or instructor. Patron-requested cancellations must be received three days before the second meeting for full refund/credit. No refund/credit will be issued after this time. For cash or check transaction refunds, please allow four to six weeks to process. **Aquatics program** cancellations must be made seven days prior to the first meeting. Late requests will be processed as an account credit for 50% of the fee. Withdrawals/refunds are not available once the program begins. Bus Excursion cancellations must be made two weeks in advance of excursion. Cancellation of programs due to weather or facility maintenance will be processed as an account credit on a per participant/class basis.

Contract Instructor Material Fees

In addition to the registration fee, some contract instructors may charge a material fee for supplies or costumes. Material fees are paid directly to the contract instructor and are the responsibility of the instructor. Any issues with supplies received or refund requests must be handled directly with the contract instructor.

A signed Release, Waiver, and Assumption of Risk is required for all program participants.




