

## LETTER FROM THE COMMUNICATIONS MANAGER



Dear Resident,

Another summer filled with fun, concerts, movie nights, adventures at DryTown, Thursday Night on the Square and much more has just flown by! The days are starting to get shorter, the leaves are beginning to change and in no time the holiday season will be upon us.

If you get the chance, stop by Poncitlán Square in the early fall to catch the beautiful colors of the leaves changing in the park. Here in California, we don't have the sort of magnificent fall foliage that they do in the New England states, but here you can get a nice taste of it.

Speaking of change, there are some changes coming to Palmdale's method of conducting municipal elections as well as date changes for those elections. Beginning with the November 2016 elections, Palmdale will conduct its general municipal elections in November of even-numbered years. There will be no general municipal election for the seats of Mayor or City Council in Palmdale in November 2015.

Elections for City Council seats to be held by districts. Four districts have been established and there will be one City Council seat to represent each district. Voters will be able to vote only for a candidate from their district. The election for the Mayor's seat will remain at-large.

All this information will be explained at a series of community meetings in August and September. We're encouraging our residents to attend a meeting to learn more about the upcoming changes. ## Oasis Wellness Village Planned for Palmdale

Thomas Partners Properties (TPP) has announced plans to create The Oasis Wellness Village, a first-of-its-kind development that will serve as a model for better health, healthcare and wellness delivery nationally, adjacent to Palmdale Regional Medical Center.

The Oasis is a 420,000 square foot project across more than 17.5 acres that includes multiple districts to promote health and wellness to provide an entire continuum of care in addition to hospitality, retail and dining opportunities for Palmdale and Los Angeles County residents.

The \$200 million project will create thousands of new good paying jobs for the area and provide a variety of proposed public amenities and public infrastructure improvements to enhance the overall project look and feel, including a public pavilion, parking and circulation amenities, park, pedestrian areas, signage, decor, and landscaping.

TPP is collaborating with nationally renowned leaders in healthcare to provide safe, reliable and branded healthcare providers.

Groundbreaking is expected in June of 2016.

"This is the future of healthcare in America," said TPP President John Thomas. "The Oasis Wellness Village brings together the world's finest physicians with everything from imaging and physical therapy to yoga and farmers markets ... a true integration of health and wellness."

"The City is thrilled and incredibly supportive of The Oasis," said Economic Development Manager Kari Blackburn. "It will be a village, a place to nurture wellness that will introduce new technologies from streamlining check-in with RFID "Smart Check In" to providing a spa-like environment for visitors to relax, be well and enjoy their experience."

## Mom and Pops Popping Up in Palmdale

Palmdale's restaurants include some of the biggest names and most popular chains in the nation. Eateries such as **Yard House**, **Claim Jumper**, **Red Lobster**, **Olive Garden**, **Outback**, **The Habit**, **El Torito**, **Chili's**, **Buffalo's Café**, **BJ's**, **Famous Dave's**, **Red Robin**, **Buffalo Wild Wings**—the list goes on—have made Palmdale their home in the Antelope Valley.

But Palmdale has a growing number of “mom and pop” restaurants—locally owned and operated—that offer unique and delicious cuisine in a variety of styles.

Two of the newest are located off the beaten path on E. Ave. Q-6, just north of Palmdale Blvd. **Lee Esther's Creole and Cajun Cooking** and **Taco Guadalajara Grill** serve up some of the best Cajun and Mexican food in the Antelope Valley. Located next to one of the oldest Japanese “mom and pops” in the Valley, **Shogun**, this trio of restaurants are favorites of local and visiting foodies, who have given them glowing reviews on the popular site, Yelp.

On the east side of Palmdale, the Valley's first craft-your-own personal pizza purveyor **Pizza Experience** (with the *only* whole wheat crust in the AV) and **Ni Hao Sushi**, both located in the Super Target Center, bring local twists to popular foods. Also located nearby is **Mediterranean Delight**, specializing in Middle Eastern cuisine and bakery items.

West Palmdale is home to one of the most popular Japanese restaurants in the Valley, **Goldfish**, located in the Von's Shopping Center on Rancho Vista Blvd. Next door is **Angkor** (formerly **Mana**), which offers a wide selection of Asian specialties, while **Los Arcos** offers tasty Mexican food just steps away.


Not to be outdone by the eastern and western shopping districts in the city, Central Palmdale has its share of fine “mom and pops.” **Irene's Café** dishes up everything from burgers to salads. For decades, **Tokyo Steak** has been dazzling diners with its teppanyaki style table specialties. Newcomer **Boulevard Café** is making a name for itself with the breakfast and lunch crowds, while **Hatsuki Japanese** has reopened in the spirit

of its former incarnation which was a popular destination in Palmdale's early years. For those who enjoy Chinese food, look no farther than **Dragon Palace** on Palmdale Blvd. Thai food lovers have their choice between **Thai Palms** and **Jasmine Thai**. And if you're in the City Hall area, both **Scramblez** and **El Patron** will certainly please your taste buds.

Heading north, two new eateries are open in the Home Depot center off Rancho Vista Blvd. just east of the freeway. **LU&PE** serves homemade Mexican, while **House of Kabob** offers kabobs, shawarma, rotisserie chicken and other Mideast delights.

Finally, 10th West has its fair share of dining options. **Mediterranean Fresh** presents delicious entrees from the Middle East, while **Gino's** brings Italian, **Boom Boom Chicken** Korean, and **Baracoa** Cuban restaurant and wine bar Caribbean flair to the High Desert. Heading north on 10th, diners can choose from **Bakery Express**, **Chely's Café**, **I Love Sushi & BBQ**, **Fire Island Grill** and the newly opened **Dragon Garden**.

There are other delicious “mom and pops” in Palmdale which are sure to please the palates of those who seek new and unique tastes. Why not treat yourself to a delicious new dining experience while helping the local economy?

### Tie-One-On Campaign



This year's events which included "Desert Dazzle," an illegal dumping clean-up event to restore the natural desert beauty around 70th Street East & Avenue R; "Manzanita Magic," a revitalization of Manzanita Heights neighborhood park, which included a custom designed and fabricated playground fence courtesy of Public Works Maintenance; "Courson Clean & Green," a day of sprucing up the City's first park; and "Global Youth Service Day," a beautification of one of Palmdale's most frequented parks.

"At each event, you could see the positive energy and community pride, which continues to grow more and more each year," said Administrative Analyst Cheryl Hughes.


In all, the Season of Service events had a combined total of 453 volunteers completing 1,800 hours of service.

## Upcoming Public Works Projects

Your Public Works Department has several important projects going on to improve our infrastructure, increase safety and make our daily lives better.

- **Rancho Vista Blvd. and 10th Street East Traffic Signal**  
Project will include paving at the intersection of Rancho Vista Blvd., and 10th Street East, a traffic signal, dedicated left-turn lanes for northbound and southbound traffic, and it will also provide a protected left turn phase for northbound and southbound vehicles.
- **Traffic Signal Synchronization Project Phases II & III**  
Modification of an existing traffic signal at Avenue N/10th Street West; construction of 7 miles of new HDPE fiber conduit in various locations (10th Street West between Avenue M and Avenue O-4; 25th East/Avenue S to Pearblossom Hwy; Pearblossom Hwy./25th East to 47th East; Avenue S/40th East to 55th East; new traffic signals at Avenue S and 55th East; Pearblossom Hwy, 37th East, Arnold Drive and 25th East; and installation of CCTV cameras at various locations.
- **McAdam Pool Renovation** – Work will include a new pool liner, main drain line improvements, pool mechanical equipment upgrades, ADA improvements to the pool deck and bath house. Work is anticipated to be completed in time for summer 2016.
- **Pelona Vista Park Field Improvements** – Continued improvement of northern soccer fields.
- **Road Overlay & Cape Seal Program** – Beginning in September road work will take place at the following locations:
  - Area bounded by 65th West to 70th West at M-8
  - 10th Place from Q-3 to Palmdale Blvd
  - Avenue Q-5 from 10th East to 10th Place East
  - Area bounded by 35th East to 37th East from Avenue S to Desert Oak
  - Area bounded by 30th East/35th East from Palmdale Blvd to Avenue R
  - Area bounded by 37th East – 40th East from Avenue S to S-8
  - Full reconstruction of Avenue P-4 and P-5 east of 10th Street East
  - M-8, 65th West and Cleo Vista
  - Housing tract south of Avenue S, west of 25th East
  - Rancho Vista Blvd., railroad tracks to 9th Street East

## Holiday Reminder: Keep FOG Out of Your Sink

The holiday season brings families together for fun, festivities and a lot of great food. Nothing can put the damper on a great celebration than having a sewer overflow in the neighborhood due to FOG—Fats, Oils and Grease—dumped down kitchen sinks.

Therefore, the City is continuing to remind local residents and businesses to keep FOG out of household sinks and drains.

“Around Thanksgiving and Christmas we sometimes are faced with sewer blockages due to the build-up of fats, oils and grease, which include cooking oils, salad dressings, sandwich spreads, meat drippings, meat juices, meat fat and other similar products that are dumped down the sink,” said Palmdale's Utilities Services Manager Gordon Phair. “Deep-frying turkeys is very popular but many people do not know the proper procedure to dispose of the used cooking oil. This used cooking oil can be disposed at the Antelope Valley Environmental Collection Center (AVECC) on the first and third Saturday of every month.”


“Over time, when people dump FOG items down the sink, it results in sewer backups that can overflow onto the streets and even into the home, which can damage both property and the environment,” Phair said.

The City of Palmdale recommends the following in regards to handling FOG materials:

- Never pour fats, oils and grease down the sink or garbage disposal.
- Pour fats, oils and grease after they have cooled into a sturdy container, such as an empty glass jar or coffee can. Once the container is full, close the lid securely and place it in the trash.
- Prior to washing, scrape and dry wipe pots, pans and dishes with paper towels and dispose of those materials in the trash.
- Use sink strainers to catch food items, and empty the strainer into the trash.
- To recycle large amounts of leftover oil from deep-frying a turkey, please contact AVECC at 1-888-CLEAN LA (1-888-449-7587).
- For businesses or households with large volumes of FOG, contact 661/267-5272 for recycling options.

“By helping to prevent sewer blockages, you are helping your home, your pocketbook, and the environment,” said Phair. “It is important to remember that each household in our City plays an important role in preventing neighborhood sewer blockages.”

- Saturday, Aug. 29 – Buena Vista Elementary School, 37005 Hillcrest Drive – 9 am (District 4)
- Wednesday, Sept. 2 – Palmdale City Council Chamber, 38300 Sierra Highway, Suite B, 7 pm (District 1). This will be part of the regularly scheduled City Council meeting.

Residents are encouraged to attend one of the meetings. Maps of the new districts and updated election information will be made available.

Pursuant to Ordinance No. 1470, Palmdale will conduct its general municipal elections in November of even-numbered years beginning with the November 8, 2016 election. There will be no general municipal election for the seats of Mayor or City Council in Palmdale in November 2015.

The ordinance also calls for elections for City Council seats to be held by districts. Four districts have been established and there will be one City Council seat to represent each district. Voters will be able to vote only for a candidate from their district. The election for the Mayor's seat will remain at-large.

# PACE Program Available for Energy and Water Conservation Projects




The City's Property Assessed Clean Energy (PACE) program provides the opportunity for residents to finance up to 100 percent of certain types of energy efficiency projects through an assessment on the property taxes of their home. PACE may be used for projects such as the installation of solar (photovoltaic or thermal) systems, insulation, or upgrading heating/air conditioning systems.

PACE may also be used for water conservation projects such as installing irrigation controls, artificial turf and other water saving measures.

Currently, the City has two PACE programs in place. For residents, there is the Home Energy Renovation Opportunity (HERO) program which homeowners may use to do both energy and water efficiency projects at their homes. For commercial property owners, the City offers funding opportunities through Figtree Financing.

"If you are looking to do a water efficient project on your home, but are concerned about how to fund it, these programs are well worth looking into," said Administrative Analyst Ben Lucha.

## Rider Relief Now Available at SAVES

The City's South Antelope Valley Emergency Services (SAVES) is offering Rider Relief Transportation Program (RRTP) coupons for use on Antelope Valley Transit Authority transportation to the most economically vulnerable and transit-dependent seniors, K-12 grade students, disabled persons, and full time college/vocational students in Palmdale.

"You can save up to \$10 on your transit pass if your income qualifies you for Metro's Rider Relief Transportation Program," said SAVES Coordinator Patricia Morales. "If eligible, you'll get fare subsidy coupons to use each month when buying your transit pass from participating providers and pass sales outlets."

The types of subsidy coupons in the RRTP program include:

- \$10 subsidy coupon** – Riders that purchase regular monthly or weekly passes, provided that their city or the county does not provide a subsidy
- \$6 Subsidy coupon** – Senior citizen riders of cities who do not offer any user side subsidy
- \$6 Subsidy coupon** – Kindergarten through 12th grade students of cities or schools that do not provide a subsidy
- \$6 Subsidy coupon** – College-vocational students provided that their city or the county or school does not provide a subsidy

In addition to AVTA, Rider Relief coupons may be used on Big Blue Bus, Culver City Bus Lines, Torrance Transit, LADOT, Santa Clarita Transit, Foothill Transit, Long Beach Transit, Montebello Bus Lines and Norwalk Transit.

Adult riders, senior/disabled/Medicare, K-12 grade students and full time college/vocational students are eligible if their incomes are:

ANNUAL INCOME	PERSONS IN HOUSEHOLD
\$28,550 or below	1
\$32,600 or below	2
\$36,700 or below	3
\$40,750 or below	4
\$44,050 or below	5
\$47,300 or below	6



Children over 5 years old whose parents qualify are automatically eligible to receive Rider Relief coupons.
