

Best of the West

An Economic Home Run for Palmdale

You've probably seen them at Palmdale restaurants or at the AV Mall: groups of uniformed softball players with their teammates and parents enjoying an after game meal or doing some in between game shopping to unwind.

They're here because one of Southern California's premier softball complexes — the Best of the West Softball Complex (BOTW) in Palmdale — attracts them by the thousands.

"The BOTW Softball Complex is one of the City's busiest facilities," said Recreation Supervisor Ryan Herman. "This year alone we hosted 11 two-day tournaments and nine one-day tournaments, bringing hundreds of teams from Southern California and the Western states to Palmdale."

"These tournaments had an economic impact of over \$3.4 million in 2015 alone," Herman said. "Over 80 percent of our tournament participants stayed in local hotels. They spend money here on food, gas, clothing and entertainment."

Nora Ortega, director of sales for Hilton Garden Inn, says for the past several years they have received reservations for blocks of rooms at a time for softball tournaments. "Hotel activity is generally strong in the summer but tournaments also help fill rooms during

slower periods," Ortega said. Hilton Garden Inn also does its part to help local restaurants by putting out menus in their lobby as well as notifying them of upcoming tournaments so the restaurants can provide up-to-date menus or advertise specials to attract business.

Besides tournaments, BOTW's eight fields are used locally year round — day and night — for men's/coed slow pitch, men's fast pitch, youth softball, baseball, coaches pitch and t-ball.

Opening in 2006, BOTW was part of the City's Vision Project that voters approved to fund building recreational facilities including DryTown Water Park, Palmdale Oasis Pool, Palmdale Oasis Recreation Center, Marie Kerr Park Pool, Palmdale Amphitheater and Marie Kerr Recreation Center.

The BOTW Softball Complex features eight world-class, year-round softball fields, four 315' fenced fields with lighting, four 210' fenced fields with lighting including covered seating, covered stadium seating (championship field), bullpens, covered dugouts, vendor/snack bar areas, and full restroom facilities. Crash Barrier Made in Palmdale Protected Pope

Mobile deployable vehicle crash barriers built by Delta Scientific in Palmdale, the leading manufacturer of counter-terrorist vehicle control systems used in the United States and internationally, helped police and security personnel protect Pope Francis from a possible vehicle bomb attack and errant drivers as he traveled to various venues in Washington, DC, Philadelphia and New York between September 22-27.

AVC Campus Planned for East Palmdale

Work will begin soon on the Palmdale campus of Antelope Valley College. With \$8 million in its FY 2015/16 budget, AVC will renovate a former supermarket and medical buildings on the north side of the 2200 block of Palmdale Blvd., tripling the size of its current location at Palmdale Blvd. and 15th St. East from 18,000 to 50,000 square feet, with the capacity to accommodate more than 7,000 students.

The goal is to open the new center for the start of the 2016 academic year.



High Speed Rail Systems Moving Forward

Two high speed rail lines are steps closer to converging in Palmdale.

China Railway International Group Co. Ltd. and XpressWest have agreed to form a joint venture that will accelerate the launch of the XpressWest rail project ultimately connecting Las Vegas to Los Angeles. The project will develop, finance, build and operate what is being called the Southwest Rail Network, with stations in Las Vegas, Victorville and Palmdale, and service throughout Los Angeles.

Construction is planned to begin as early as September 2016.

XpressWest will use fully electric train sets that are capable of speeds in excess of 150 MPH, delivering passengers to Las Vegas in 80 minutes with non-stop service every 20 minutes during peak times, and up to every 12 minutes as demand requires. The average round trip fare is currently estimated at \$89.

The California High Speed Rail train system and station is scheduled to arrive in Palmdale by 2021-2022. The segment of the rail line located between Palmdale and Burbank will be environmentally reviewed by California High Speed Rail Authority over the next two years. While this is occurring, the City's Public Works Department and Planning Division are teaming together to manage three transit-oriented development (TOD) projects near the existing Palmdale Transportation Center (PTC), and future home of a high speed rail multi-modal station. The studies focus on establishing a vision for development of the station and area surrounding the station, public outreach, land use planning, housing, transportation, infrastructure and economic development.

The two train systems will eventually meet at a multi-modal high speed rail train station in Palmdale.



Consolidated Elections

The Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors voted to consolidate Palmdale’s municipal elections beginning in November 2016.

For voters, this means there will be one ballot on Election Day, November 8, 2016, which will include Palmdale’s general municipal elections for Mayor and City Council, along with all other local, county, state and federal elections.

Pursuant to Ordinance No. 1470, Palmdale will conduct its general municipal elections in November of even-numbered years beginning with the November 8, 2016 election.

The ordinance also calls for elections for City Council seats to be held by districts. Four districts have been established and there will be one City Council seat to represent each district. Voters will be able to vote only for a candidate from their district. The election for the Mayor’s seat will remain at-large.

Footsteps2Brilliance

Footsteps2Brilliance is a bilingual application that features a library of ebooks and more than 230 educational games available in English and Spanish to help children improve their vocabulary and reading comprehension skills. Are You Ready for El Niño?

Experts are estimating that the coming El Niño winter storms will be the strongest in years. Cities and agencies throughout Los Angeles County are already preparing.

It provides storm-related resources including safety tips, weather forecasts, and information for homeowners affected by floods and mudslides. Visitors can also find info guides, PSAs, and a dedicated Twitter feed of first responder agencies tweeting about this year's storms on the website. It is mobile-friendly and can be instantly translated into 90 languages.

Preparing for Winter

Each October, the City of Palmdale's Public Works crews begin preparations for the winter season, which often brings rain and snow to the area. Among the steps taken include:

- Inspecting all storm basins and flood channels to make sure they are clean, free of debris and functioning properly
- Making sandbags
- Installing snow plows on trucks
- Budgeting
- Arranging for contractors
- Inspecting sewers

Storms, Floods & Mudslides: Tips and Information

This information is provided courtesy of the County of Los Angeles' Emergency Survival Guide.

Before a Flood

1. Assess the safety of your house and belongings in case of a flood or mudslide.

- Are you near a creek?
- Do you live above or below a steep hillside?
- Do you have to drive over a creek or bridge to get to a main road?

2. Clean drains and gutters around the house in the fall before the winter rains come.

3. If diversion of water or mud is necessary, plan to fill sandbags well before the rain starts; sandbags are available at your local fire stations. Take time now to find out what fire station serves your area and learn proper placement of sandbags. Sand bags are also available at the City's maintenance yard, located at 39110 3rd Street East across from Desert Sands Park.

4. If you live in a hilly area, maintain all slopes in a safe manner. Use appropriate plantings, slope coverage, and drainage channels.

When It's Raining

Plan to arrive at your location before it starts raining and remain there until well after the storm. Burned logs, boulders, mud and other debris can create temporary dams which burst after the rain has stopped. This could be hours or sometimes even days after the rain has stopped. Be particularly alert when driving. Watch the road for collapsed pavement, mud, fallen rocks, and other hazards. Bridges may be washed out, and culverts overtopped. When you see water across a roadway, there is no way to see whether the road under the water has been washed away. The water may be much more deep and powerful than you expect.

During the Flood

- Do not cross rapidly flowing streams. Stay on one side until the water recedes. Most streams will go down in a couple of hours, once it stops raining.
- During a storm, check drainage systems at your home and driveways to maintain a safe situation and limit damage.

- Watch for mudslides and adjust drainage to reduce mudslides.

- If you notice major mud slippage either above or below your house, move your family to a safe location. If you need emergency assistance, call 9-1-1.

After the Flood

- Don't return to your flood-damaged home before the area is declared to be safe by law enforcement and health officials.

- Assess damage; check hillsides, houses, etc. for slope movement, settling, and water damage.

- Following a storm, drive slowly and carefully as many roads may have mud, debris, holes, and washed-out areas. This is particularly true when driving around public works and other public safety personnel are doing cleanup efforts.

- Remember, many mudslides occur as the soil dries after an extended wet period, so a mudslide may take place several days after the rain stops.

- Winter is often the best time to plant slopes, so make plans and fix any problems areas before the rainy season begins.

Additional Tips

- Have a plan in place before an evacuation is ordered. The safest plan is to stay with friends or family during all rainstorms in which a flash flood watch or warning has been declared for your area.

- Teach your children to stay away from all rivers, creeks, arroyos, drainage control channels and washes.

- Teach all family members about the watch and warning system.

- Determine in advance how you will stay informed about the latest flood and flash flood watches, warnings, and weather advisories.

- Talk to your neighbors about their plans, and encourage them to plan to get out early.

- Pay attention to local news and social media from local government and public safety agencies for information on what to do during an emergency incident.



If You See Something, Say Something Reporting Graffiti, Crime & More

The City of Palmdale offers several options for residents to report incidents of graffiti, crime, stray shopping carts, traffic signal or maintenance issues.

By Phone: 94-PRIDE (947-7433)

The Palmdale Pride Line allows residents the ease of remembering and using only one telephone number, 94-PRIDE (947-7433) — instead of five different telephone numbers — to report graffiti, anonymous crime tips, stray shopping carts, traffic signal or maintenance issues and park watch concerns. The hotline phone number is available 24 hours a day, seven days a week.

“When a person dials one number, 94-PRIDE, they will have a menu choice of five items,” said Communications Manager John Mlynar. “They can select the menu item they wish to contact, or they will hear the phone number for City Hall that they may call during regular business hours,” he said.

An anonymous Crime Tip hotline that rings at the Palmdale Sheriff’s Station — 661/272-2414 — is also in operation. “This is for any ongoing incidents that residents may see and would like the Sheriff’s Department to look into,” Mlynar said. “If anyone sees a crime in progress or suspicious activity, they should call the Sheriff’s main number at 661/272-2400. If it is a life threatening emergency, then they should call 911.”

The City also has established an after hours emergency number, 661/267-5338. Residents may use that number after 6 pm and before 7:30 am Monday through Thursday and all day Friday, Saturday and Sunday to report issues such as sewer overflows, roadway/right-of-way hazards including downed tree limbs, downed signs and potholes, or broken sprinkler lines in City parks and landscaped areas.

Many issues may be reported online at the City’s website, www.cityofpalmdale.org. There are links on the homepage to report graffiti, code violations, parking violations, stray shopping carts, street light outages, traffic signal, and street, sewer, landscape, park and facility maintenance.

MyWaste App

A collaboration between the City of Palmdale and Waste Management, MyWaste™ is a free smart phone app that enables residents to report problems such as graffiti, potholes, illegal dumping, non-working traffic signals, clogged sewer drains and broken irrigation pipes in addition to receiving alerts of trash/recycling collection days and notifications for street sweeping.

The app also allows users the option to receive reminders during times when there are changes to their schedule such as holidays, provides answers to frequently asked questions, offers a quick and easy way to figure out whether or not an item is recyclable, and allows reporting of issues such as missed collections or street sweeping.

The My-Waste™ app is available free via the App Store for iPhone and Droid.

The High Cost of Illegal Dumping

The community of Palmdale is actively engaged in efforts to clean-up our beautiful desert. In addition to those efforts, citizens have reported 26 percent more cases of illegal dumping in the last year, allowing the City's Code Enforcement team to investigate the source, patterns and locations of illegal dumping. This information helps us determine the best enforcement actions based on available resources and current trends.

Not only does Code Enforcement staff work alongside the Public Works Maintenance crew in cleaning up illegal dumping, but they also go the extra mile to investigate any pieces of evidence that might lead to a conviction. Yes, they actually do dig through the trash! A conviction might come in the form of a judgment to pay an administrative fine up to \$10,000 or a criminal conviction may be imposed.

Keep in mind, it is every property owner's responsibility to check and maintain their property, no matter how large or small, whether it's vacant or developed. If you hire a contractor for remodeling of any kind, it is a good idea to verify that they disposed of the debris legally because *you* are responsible for that trash.

If you are the owner of a vacant property, here are some tips:

- Use a property manager to check and clean the property
- Register vacant houses with the City of Palmdale so we can contact you with reports of any Municipal Code violation
- Obtain a Letter of Agency from the City, which includes posting the property with "No Trespassing" signs
- Require dump receipts from contractors who provide clean-up services
- Perform periodic removal of weeds and dead vegetation so the parcel doesn't appear abandoned

Palmdale's Municipal Code requires every residence and business to maintain current weekly trash service with Waste Management. Along with weekly trash, green waste, and recycling collection services, it also comes with curbside pick-up of bulky items and landfill vouchers for larger clean-ups. Code Enforcement works closely with Waste Management to make sure all properties are brought into compliance.


"The biggest contribution from the community in regard to illegal dumping would be to report it," said Administrative Analyst Cheryl Hughes. "If you see something, say something. Whether you see it in your neighborhood, on vacant property, or alongside the road, please take the time to report it. When dumping is reported quickly, evidence is more likely to be found and traced. If you see dumping happening, consider trying to get a license plate number, but *never* put yourself in a dangerous position to do this."

Our Code Enforcement team works diligently to implement programs that combat illegal dumping. In cases where the situation has grown to a health hazard or blight, the City takes legal action to clean up properties: a lien is placed against the property, which can add up to thousands of dollars. "It's always cheaper for a property owner to do the work than have the City do it for them," adds Hughes. In the words of former US Deputy Attorney General Paul McNulty, "If you think compliance is expensive — try non-compliance."

2016 Season of Service

The City of Palmdale's Season of Service was honored to receive the prestigious Helen Putnam Award for Excellence from the California League of Cities in the category of Public Works, Infrastructure and Transportation.
