Gnomes Set to Invade Thursday Night on the Square
“Plutopalooza,” Swing Music by Phat Cat Swinger Featured

PALMDALE – The City of Palmdale’s popular Thursday Night on the Square (TNOTS) will hit the halfway mark with the fourth of eight free events this Thursday, July 16, from 5:30 to 8:30 pm at Poncitlán Square (9th St. East between Ave. Q-9 & Ave. Q-10).

An Antelope Valley institution that is celebrating its 15th season, families can enjoy TNOTS’ live music, enticing food, free City activities for kids and an open-air market featuring specialty items.

“This week’s theme is ‘Just Say Gnome,’” said Recreation Supervisor Annie Pagliaro. “When you look around the Square, you’ll see Gnomes everywhere! Kids can make their own gnome cone hat and fuzzy white beard, and a fishing pole down at our ol’ fishing hole.”

Music will be provided by Swing favorites Phat Cat Swinger.

This will be the final week for kids to create custom gift bags for the athletes from Cyprus and St. Lucia who will be visiting Palmdale from July 21-24 as part of the Special Olympics World Games Los Angeles 2015. Materials will be available at the City of Palmdale’s booth.

The AERO Institute will present “Plutopalooza: NASA’s New Horizons Mission to Pluto” a solar system themed exhibition with hands on activities at 6 and 6:45 pm inside the AERO building. Guest speaker Dr. Dana Backman, SOFIA Outreach Director will be

on hand to discuss “SOFIA: Chasing Pluto’s Shadow,” as part of the presentaton.

In addition to the music and activities, each week one lucky person will get caught “green-handed” – disposing of recyclable and non-recyclable waste in the proper container – will win a backpack made of recycled materials, courtesy of Waste Management, which will be filled with DryTown passes, treats and Palmdale Amphitheater Summer Concert Series tickets.
