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Still Time to Register for “Winning Arguments” College Essay Class

PALMDALE – The first session of the City of Palmdale hosted class entitled titled “Winning Arguments: College Essays for High School Students,” will begin on Sept. 2 and run through Sept. 25 on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 4 to 5:30 pm in the Recreation Center at Marie Kerr Park Recreation Center, located at 2723 Rancho Vista Blvd.

The class will teach students how to improve their college admissions essays, SAT writing scores, and rankings on college and university English placement tests. The cost of the class is \$40, plus a \$15 fee for materials (payable to the instructor on the first day of class).

“Winning Arguments” will be taught by Anne Yale, a local author, poet, and teacher who started the Law & Government Academy at Highland High School and served as its first program coordinator. Participants will receive individual feedback and strategies for producing effective college essays. Special attention will be given to college-level vocabulary and writing with syntactic variety.

“The key to college success lies in the ability to make effective academic arguments,” said Yale. “Just like an attorney, you must begin by examining the evidence, evaluating your opponent’s arguments, and formulating successful counter-arguments. The trick, then, is presenting them in writing in the conventional essay format. Everything’s an argument! But only the *best* arguments win.”

The next sessions will run Sept. 30 through Oct. 23; and Oct. 28 through Nov. 20.
