“Curiosity Machine” Continues This Saturday at Palmdale City Library

PALMDALE – The “Curiosity Machine,” a free, fun, multi-week science program will be on hand at the Palmdale City Library, 700 E. Palmdale Blvd., this Saturday, February 28. From 11 am to 1 pm.

The “Curiosity Machine” is a web-based program that encourages young scientists to create and test science projects, called “challenges,” with an emphasis on problem-solving and creativity. Each week, kids will work as a group to conquer a new “challenge,” then submit their creations through the Curiosity Machine website for feedback from actual engineers and scientists. It will be at the Palmdale City Library on consecutive Saturdays now through March 14 from 11 am to 1 pm.

“Calling all scientists ages 9 to 12!” said Children’s Librarian Marissa Thompson. “Your brilliant minds are needed for challenges such as making a flat ball, engineering a skyscraper for the wind, and designing a boat that can zip through the ocean.”
