LOS ANGELES COUNTY TO OPEN LOCAL ASSISTANCE CENTER IN THE AFTERMATH OF FLASH FLOODS IN THE ANTELOPE VALLEY

On Thursday, October 15, 2015, a severe storm with flash floods caused road closures and damage to many private homes and businesses in the Antelope Valley, particularly the areas of Lake Elizabeth, Lake Hughes, Leona Valley, Green Valley and the cities of Lancaster and Palmdale.

Many people experienced damage to their personal properties and businesses. In response, the Los Angeles County Office of Emergency Management will setup and open a Local Assistance Center (LAC). A LAC serves as a one-stop-shop where individuals, families and business owners can obtain information on services and assistance from government agencies, utility companies and non-profits.
