Free Skate Clinic for Autistic Youth at Marie Kerr Skate Park

PALMDALE – The City of Palmdale’s Marie Kerr Skate Park, located at 39700 30th St. West, will host a free skateboard clinic presented by the A.skate Foundation for autistic youth from 10 am to 1 pm on Sunday, June 1.

Families may register at www.askate.org. There is room for 60 participants. The event is being co-sponsored by Pacific Child & Family Associates, Squirry’s Collision Center, and the AV Autism Awareness Walk.

The A.skate Foundation is an organization that allows children with autism to be a part of our social world through skateboarding. They hold clinics for children with autism at no cost to the families, give grants to children with autism for skateboard gear, as well as promote awareness and educate families about the skateboard industry. Five years ago 1:150 children were diagnosed with autism. Today one out of 68 children are diagnosed with autism.
