#### **LeAnn Rimes Concert Rescheduled for September 25 at the Palmdale Amphitheater**

PALMDALE – The City of Palmdale has announced that the concert for country star LeAnn Rimes, which was postponed on July 23 due to the effects of the Sand Fire, has been rescheduled for Sunday, Sept. 25 at 7:30 pm at the Palmdale Amphitheater, located at 2723 Rancho Vista Blvd.

“We are thrilled that LeAnn Rimes will take the Amphitheater stage for what promises to be an excellent show on a beautiful Sunday evening,” said Director of Recreation and Culture Keri Smith.

To show appreciation for all their efforts in fighting the Sand Fire, members of the U.S. Forest Service, Los Angeles County Fire Department and Los Angeles County Sheriff’s Department will receive free admission for themselves and a guest to the concert, simply by showing their ID or badge at the ticket booth.

“Not only will we be treated to an amazing performance by LeAnn, but we’ll also get to say ‘thanks’ to the brave men and women who protect us from disasters such as the Sand Fire,” Smith said.

General admission tickets are available at [www.palmdaleamphitheater.com](http://www.palmdaleamphitheater.com) for \$20. Save by purchasing tickets in advance as tickets at the gate the day of the show will be \$25. VIP seating is sold out.

Gates will open at 6 pm. Food, soft drinks, beer and wine will be available for purchase. Bring a lawn chair or blanket to sit on.

Rimes has had 42 singles on the Billboard Hot Country Songs chart, 13 of which are Top 10 hits, and has scored numerous hit singles in her career, including “Can’t Fight the Moonlight” which went #1 in 11 countries, and “How Do I Live,” which is the second longest charting song ever on the Billboard Hot 100 chart. With more than 44 million albums sold, two Grammy® Awards, three Academy of Country Music Awards and 12 Billboard Music Awards, Rimes is also the youngest recipient ever of a Grammy® Award, and the first country recording artist to win in the “Best New Artist” category.

The Summer Concert Series, now in its 12th year, will also feature **Super Soul Saturday: A Party for the Decades** featuring *DJ Streak, Bump City and Stone Soul* on July 30; **Get Jazzed at the Amp with The Herbie Kae & Tony Capko Band, Gina Eckstine and The Bill Fulton Band** on August 6, and R&B legends The Commodores on Sept. 10.

### **About The Amp**

The Amp at Marie Kerr Park is the Antelope Valley's premier outdoor entertainment venue, providing audiences with a blend of high-energy concert performances and community-based programming. Its convenient location, great sight lines and comfortable, grassy seating areas are complemented by Saturday evening concerts and Friday evening Family Movie Nights presented during summer months.

For many years, the City of Palmdale hosted the Starlight Concert Series on a baseball field at Marie Kerr Park, and guests would come as early as 3 am to set out their blankets and stake their spots to watch entertainers perform on a portable stage. There were often smaller events held prior to the concerts, like Family Western Days, Taste of the Valley and the Fourth Saturday Cruise. Soon, however, the concerts were bursting at the seams with guests, and it became clear that a larger venue was needed.

In 2005, after Palmdale residents voted for a bond measure to provide funds for the construction, the Palmdale Amphitheater was opened at the newly expanded Marie Kerr Park site, ushering in a new era. The new amphitheater featured amenities that

were not available at the old site, such as permanent restrooms, areas for food vendors, and a green room for the entertainers.
